- 2. Providing resources and infrastructure to foster a culture of integrity based on sound science, personal and professional courtesy and responsibility, and a spirit of collaboration and trust;
- 3. Developing effective processes and procedures to ensure fairness, transparency, and consistency in handling concerns related to breaches of research integrity; and,
- 4. Promoting education and trainings for the new and established researchers to raise awareness of applicable guidelines and enhance capacity to conduct research that benefits the broader society.
